

TED Scholarship Fund 2010-2011

Students from soft currency/low wage factor countries within the TED have always found it difficult to raise the money required to come to Newbold College, and in particular to start their studies at Newbold. Once in the UK usually they are able to find work locally and thereby earn money in the required currency.

At the same time, students from stronger currencies may also have a threshold to overcome when making a decision to come to Newbold and study. In most strong currency countries higher education is free, and to pay £3900 - £8800 per year seems to them unnecessary and/or unreasonable.

Besides, some countries offer financial support for students, but most often in the form of a loan or part grant and part loan.

The total sum set aside by the Division will be divided into two parts so that students from North/Western European countries and from Southern and Eastern European countries get roughly similar number of places to study. Only if there are no interested students from one part or some money still left, will the assigned portion be used for sponsoring interested students from the other geographical part.

Financial Details

The total amount available for scholarships for new TED students coming to Newbold College for 2010/2011 academic year will be spent as follows:

First year students:

1) Students from North/Western Europe (Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Ireland, Netherlands, Norway, and Sweden and UK) get 50% of tuition fees paid (£995 per semester). The student pays 50% tuition fee (£995 per semester) and the full price for accommodation and food expenses (£2325 per semester). The subsidy is £1990 per year. Ten sponsorships are available.

2) Students from Southern and Eastern European countries (Albania, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Croatia, Estonia, Greece, Hungary, Israel, Latvia, Lithuania, Macedonia, Montenegro, Poland, Serbia and Slovenia) get 100% tuition fee (£1990 per semester) and 50% of accommodation and food fee (£1163 per semester) paid. The student pays 50% of the accommodation and food expenses (£1262 per semester). The subsidy is £6306 per year. Ten sponsorships are available.

This applies under the following conditions:

- 1) The student must be in full-time study at Newbold College.
- 2) The student must attend or be a member of a local Seventh-day Adventist church within the Trans-European Division.
- 3) The sponsorship is for one full academic year (two semesters) only.
- 4) Students from the British Union Conference who get 25% BUC discount on tuition, room and board (if they purchase it) will receive additional 25% from TED for the tuition.
- 5) This scholarship does not apply to Gap year students from Western Europe. Gap year students from other TED Countries qualify for 50% discount on room and board only.
- 6) The scholarship is granted on the net fees after all other government/national/education/denominational grants have been taken into consideration. In no instance shall the total of scholarships and other grants exceed the percentage mentioned above for the cost of tuition, required fees and room and board.
